SURFACE is a group exhibition exploring a variety of approaches to surface through painting, textiles, collage, drawing, print and objects, crossing the boundaries between fine art, craft and design.

The exhibition will demonstrate the notion of surface, including pattern, repetition, texture, patina and material, as well as the deeper meanings and wider contexts beyond an object's physical surface. Each artist's practice negotiates the nature of physical surface and conceptual process, connecting the surface appearance of the work with its meaning.
